

## AP Drawing and 2-D Portfolios

### Course Overview:

In order to be accepted into the AP program students need to complete the application process. Students are required to complete a written statement as well as submit 6 pieces of artwork with the application. If the students work is familiar to the art teacher the submission of artwork may be waved. Once accepted students need to complete the summer work prior to the academic school year.

## Advanced Placement Application Form for Art

Before completing this application, please review the description of the AP program and the portfolios that are required. It is important to understand what portfolio you hope to complete, in order that you elect the course that will enable you to do so.

### Prerequisites for Studio Art – Drawing Portfolio

Drawing and Painting I, and Advanced Drawing II, and Advanced Drawing III  
It is recommended to complete three levels of drawing before entering AP Studio Art. However this recommendation may be waved with the teachers consent.

### Prerequisites for a 2-D Portfolio

Creative Imaging I & II, or Photo I & II, or Digital Photography  
Students may have any combination of these classes to participate.
